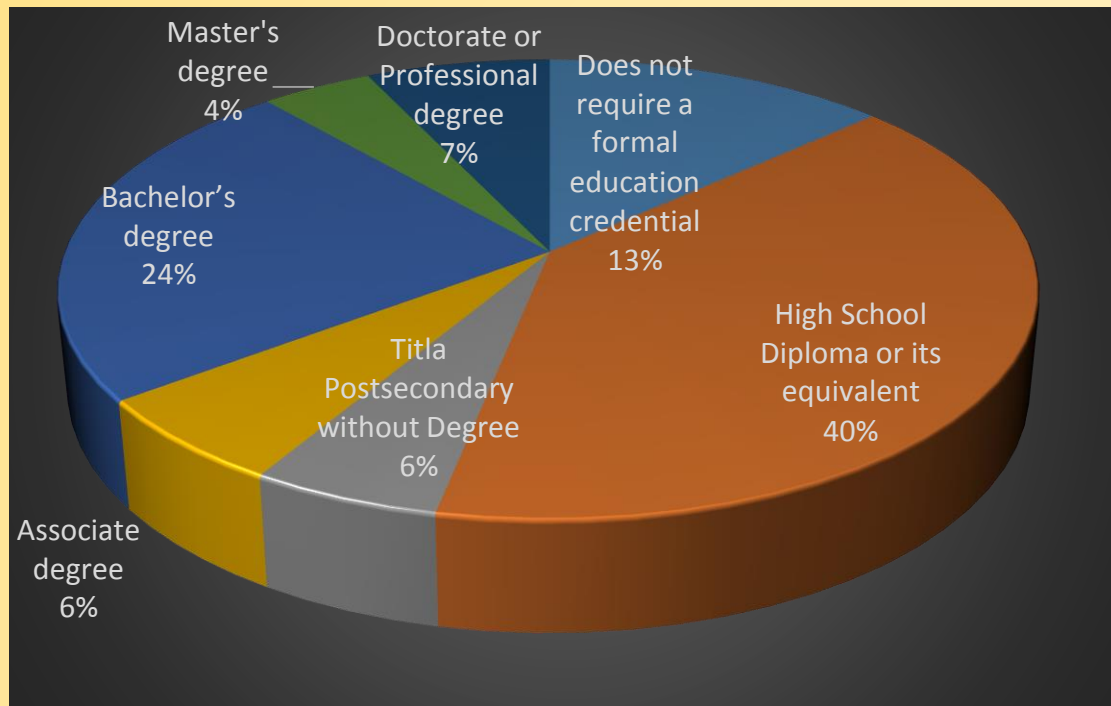


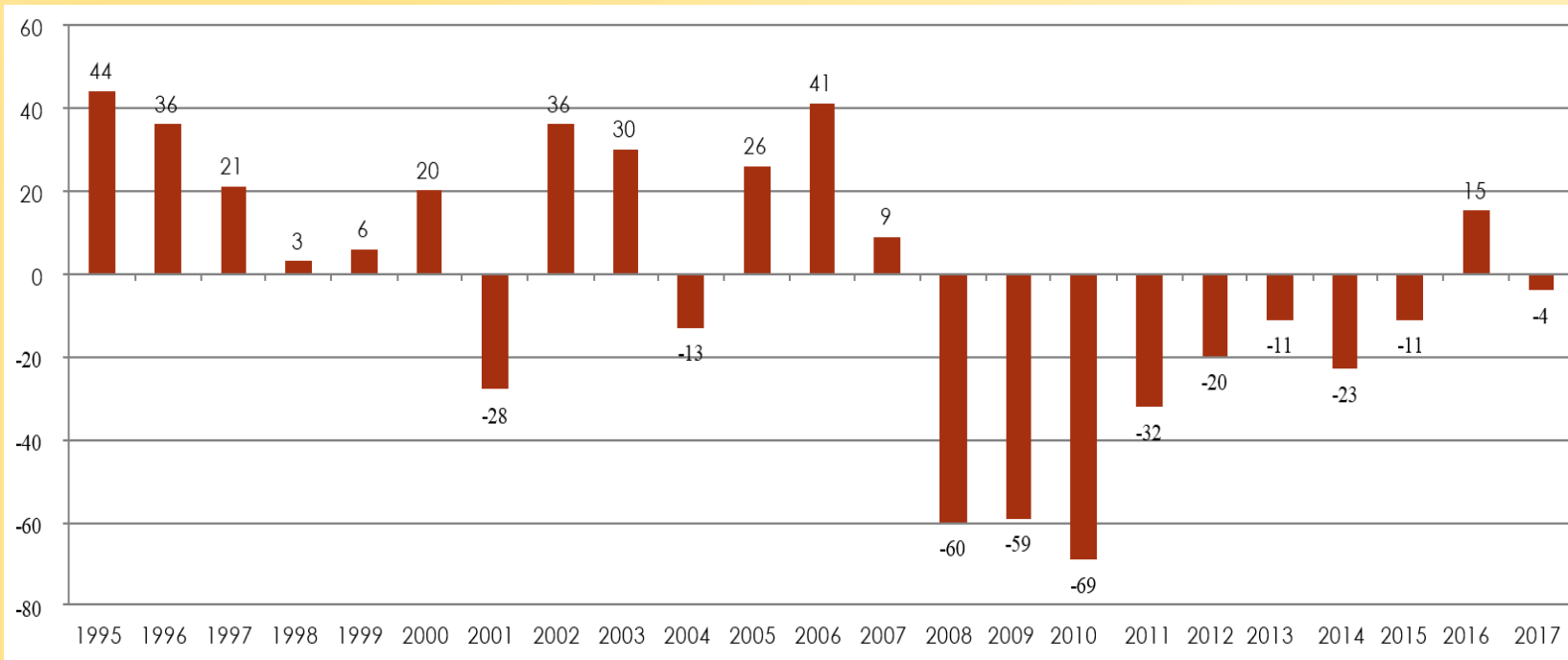
The challenge between higher education and the labor market

(Department of Labor)



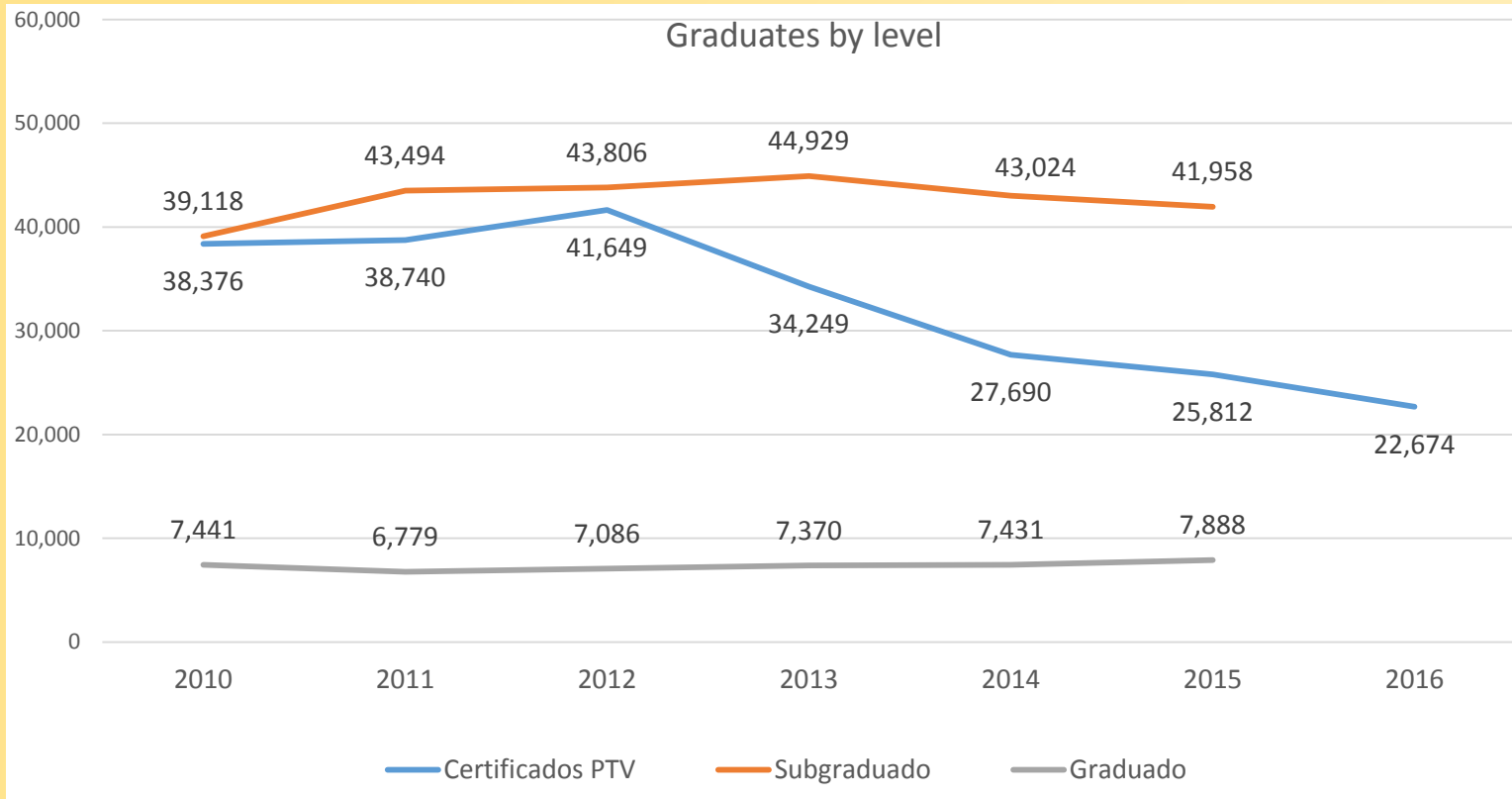
